

ColorAll Fingering Chart

Need help with fingering? *ColorAll Fingering* is a simple and easy way to quickly begin playing music:

- **Blue** fingering numbers □ = play these notes on the G string
- **Gold** fingering numbers □ = play these notes on the D string
- **Green** fingering numbers □ = play these notes on the A string
- **Purple** fingering numbers □ = play these notes on the E string

0 = open string; 1 = 1st finger; 2 = 2nd finger; 3 = 3rd finger; 4 = 4th finger

FIRST POSITION

The first position chart shows four staves of music. Above each staff are colored numbers indicating the finger used for each note. THIRD POSITION

Shifting: dashes indicate a shift to a different position. 3 dashes --- shift to 3rd position. 1 dash - shift back to 1st position. The color of the dash indicates which string to shift to. Colored fingering numbers will also become darker and italicized in higher positions.

SHIFTING EXAMPLE
